



MAR'S MISSION AND SUMMARY


The MAR acronym stands for Microsoft Authorized Refurbishers, and is a program developed by Microsoft to put outdated technology to work. MARs exist on an international level.

DONATING TECHNOLOGY

The Radnor MAR program accepts:

- older computers (see requirements below)
- smaller CRT monitors
- flat-panel monitors
- keyboards
- mice

Before bringing your older technology to Radnor High School, we ask that you contact the MAR program director, Mrs. Nancy Holshue. All computers that are donated **must** start to a working operating system and be in operational condition. As we are an outreach of an academic institution, we are unable to issue tax-deductible receipts. We do not accept Macintosh computers, laptops, or other peripherals.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

In order to give students the tools they need to succeed, all donated computers must meet these minimum requirements (if you're not sure if your equipment meets these guidelines, contact Mrs. Holshue):

- generally, we accept computers that were purchased between 3 and 4 years ago and run Windows 98 or 2000.
- *processor*: at least 233MHz
- *hard drive*: at least 20GB
- *memory*: at least 256MB

If the technology you have does not meet these requirements, Mrs. Holshue can provide a list of other organizations in our area who may be able to accept your donation.

RECEIVING TECHNOLOGY

The MAR program is happy to provide refurbished technology to students and community members unable to purchase a computer.
